I often see small javascripts that disable the ability to right-click where <u>javascript.about.com</u> has a much simpler solution:

If you are fooled by a web author in such a way, what could you do? <u>tech-recipes</u> has the answer: Of course, we can use javascript to turn it back on.

When visiting the offending website, type the following into the URL bar of your browser:

javascript:void(document.oncontextmenu=null)
