enteritis membranacea used synonymous to asthma

discovery of anaphylaxis in animal experiment

1902 Pirquet, C. von (1:65-68)

first use of the term "allergy" for anaphylactic events

neurosis theory of hay fever: "aristocracy of mind"

1903 Bullowa, Kaplan (2:344)

adrenaline as therapeutic agent

1903 Pirquet, C. von; Schick, B (1:46)

oversensitivity and accelerated reaction seen as reaction of an organism after second injection of specific antigen

1904 Rowland (2:156)

therapy of hay fever by diphtheria antitoxin

1905, 1909 Czerny (1:363)

new term: exsudative diathesis

1906 Wolff-Eisner (2:157-161)

description of toxic effect of pollen proteins: urticaria of the mucosa

1906 Schilling (2:348-349)

therapy of asthma by x-ray

1906 Langlois (2:163)

anaphylactic genesis of hay fever

1907 Billard (2:154)

therapy of hay fever with "anti-toxic" sera

1907 Weichardt (2:162)

hypersensitization after contact with foreign proteins

1908 Todd (2:158)

new term for hay fever: "pollinosis"

1908 Hamburger, F. (1:47)

hypersensitization and immunity as antipode to "allergy" in contrast to the tuberculin reaction

1909 Gillette (2:306-307)

description of allergic shock and asthma after injection of curative serum against diphtheria

1910 Von Strümpell (1:370)

description of colica mucosa as "intestinal asthma"

1910 Egbert (2:287; 2:308-309)

hay fever and asthma being the same disease

1910-12 Stäubli (1:368, 1:369)

eosinophilia as "eosinophilic diathesis"

1910 Béal (2:310)

asthma as food-induced anaphylactic phenomenon

1910 Albus (2:156)

therapy of hay fever with pooled sera of hay fever patients

1910 Meltzer, Auer, Lewis u.a. (2:304-306, 2:309-310)

asthma and hay fever as anaphylactic reaction

1911 Eli Moschcowitz (1:366)

association of eosinophilia and anaphylaxis

1911 Schittenhelm, Weichardt (1:370)

colica mucosa renamed as "enteritis anaphylactica", resemblance to asthma

1910-11 various authors (2:299-303)

severe eosinophilia in asthma patients

1911 Noon, Freeman (2:165)

hyposensitization of hay fever patients with pollen extracts

1912 Sticker (2:77)

hay fever as urban and aristocratic disease

1912 Schlecht, Schwenker (2:311; 1:365)

association of anaphylaxis and asthma, detection of local eosinophilia in lungs of guinea pigs

1913 Prausnitz (2:166)

hay fever as specific cellular anaphylaxis of mucosa

1913 Frankfurter, Storm van Leeuwen (2:347; 1:83)

therapy of asthma with tuberculin

1913 Richet, Charles

Nobel prize for the discovery of anaphylaxy (strictly limited to animal experiments)

1913 Koessler (2:311)

sensitization against proteins resulting in asthma

1912-30 various authors (2:155)

pollantin as adjuvant for hay fever patients

1913 Lérique (2:86)

gout as an anaphylactic phenomenon

1917 Auld (2:347)

therapy of asthma with peptone

1917-18 Walker (2:315)

proteins as a cause for asthma

1922 Kämmerer (2:316)

asthma as consequence of infections

1922 various authors (2:317-319)

asthma caused by bacteria, moulds, parasites, dust

1922-24 Chaufford, Llewellyn (2:86)

gout as allergic phenomenon

1924 Weil, Lettule (2:87)

gout as allergic-hyperergic inflammation

1924 Chen, Schmidt, Nagel (2:346)

therapy of asthma with ephedrine

1924 Storm van Leeuwen; Scheppegrell, Leopold brothers (2:169; 2:319-325; 2:327)

rooms with dust filters for patients with hay fever or asthma

1925 Storm van Leeuwen (2:328-329)

aspergillus, human dander and house dust as allergens

1927, 1935 Tiefensee, Zipperlen (2:321)

asthma dependent on geological formations and water table

1928-1945 various authors (2:338-340)

discovery of histological changes in lungs of asthma patients

1930-33 Cohen u.a. (2:131)

experimental sensitization of humans

1931-33 various authors (2:89)

coherence of urticaria and hay fever

1932 Campbell (4:83)

"strange lung symptoms" following farmers and haymaking

1933 Sternberg (2:162)

hay fever as allergy against pollen, prophylactic desensitization
