**Children in Munich were studied between September 1989 and July 1990 and children in East Germany were studied between October 1991 and July 1992. The fieldwork was implemented by different teams in Munich, Leipzig, and Halle. However, all coworkers from Leipzig and Halle were trained by participating in the ongoing survey in Munich. Moreover, one coworker (M.W.) who had implemented the fieldwork in Munich supervised the colleagues in Leipzig and Halle during the whole study period.**
