

I have summarized the history of <u>Post Publication Peer Review</u> starting with Pubmed Commons to the leading website PubPeer. But most recently there are at least three <u>new kids</u> <u>on the block</u>: Peer Community In, Paperstars and alphaXiv.



What is the difference?

<u>Peer Community In</u> was founded in 2017 by Denis Bourguet and colleagues, targeting researchers across disciplines with a focus on peer-reviewing and recommending preprints as an alternative to traditional journals.

<u>Paperstars</u>, launched in 2023 by currently undisclosed founders, is aimed at both the general public and researchers, focusing on making scientific papers more accessible through Al-generated summaries and visuals.

<u>alphaXiv</u> was created in 2024 by the Allen Institute for AI to serve researchers and academics by enhancing preprint discoverability through AI-powered search and summarization tools.
